
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#### A STUDY ON THE NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS) AND ITS EFFECTIVENESS IN CREATING A POOL OF EMPOWERED YOUTH

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#### ABSTRACT

Higher Education in India can play a crucial in India's aspiration of emerging as a major global economic player. Education is widely believed to be the foundation of a society's productivity and economic well-being.

The National Service Scheme is an Indian government sector public service program conducted by the Government of India, the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports takes care of National Service Scheme. It is also called NSS. It's volunteers are learners from Under Graduate & Postgraduate programs of arts, commerce, science and engineering. This option of choosing NSS is available to all learners of all educational institution of Under Graduate & Post Graduates programs throughout India.

The core objective of the NSS is to provide practical exposure to NSS volunteers regarding various social issues existing in the society. Learners can voluntarily join NSS for two years where each year they give their 120 hours and take part in various government led community service activities & programs. Learner by participation in different projects and various activities, under NSS comes close to issues and develops emotional connectivity with issues in the society.

National Social Service (NSS) volunteer's transformation into a sensible and responsible citizen happens, Young learners are energetic and dynamic. NSS activities channelise their energy in right direction. Thus National Service Scheme is a medium for the transformation from non sensitive to social sensitive youth who will take initiative to solve issues which one come across. NSS units various activities at college level, university level and special residential camp of seven days creates a opportunities for volunteers to use their time for the service of a village or local community and even they can participate in National and state events like SRD State Republic Day Parade and NRD National Republic Day Parade at Rajpath in Delhi. NSS thus is a medium that acts as a catalyst to transform young learners energy in right direction.

The objective of this research is to analyse the effectiveness of NSS in transformation of volunteer into a sensible and responsible citizen by conducting a survey of volunteers and using t-tests and factor analysis for testing the data.

Volunteers may be involved in such activities as Cleaning, afforestation, stage shows, or a procession creating awareness of such issues as social problems, education, and cleanliness, Awareness Rallies, Inviting doctors to health camps

The core methods of the National Service Scheme (NSS) are:

- Connecting volunteers with specific area of working.
- Defining requirements of the area and encouraging local public participation for understanding sustaining the work.
- Develop a sense of connectivity in volunteers with local people.
- Encourage learner to work as a team.
- Develop leadership skill.
- Develops communication skills
- Creates inner motivation.
- Provides required resources.
- Sensidize about nature.
- Introduce them to self.

#### **Evolution:**

In Begining NSS Started in 37 universities having forty thousand volunteers, the scheme has expanded rapidly and now it have more than 26 crores volunteers spread over 200 Universities, Polytechnics, Junor college Systems. The efforts of NSS volunteers is appreciated by the ministers, community, universities, colleges, and everyone as NSS volunteers always render selfless service. **Slogan:** 

The Slogan of NSS is "*Not Me But You*", contemplate the nature of democratic living and maintains the need for selfless service. NSS inculcates learners to develop gratitude for other people's opinion and also shows consideration for all living beings. The wheel depicts the cycle of formation, protection, and liberation and indicates the consistence movements in life. The Icon thus stands for change and continuty hints the continuous working of NSS for social change.

## Emblem

The NSS Symbol is embossed on the emblem. The eight bars in the wheel represent the 24 hours of a day. The red colour indicates that the volunteer is full of young blood that is vibrant, dynamic, vital, and full of exuberance. The navy-blue colour indicates the universe of which the NSS is a minute part, ready to contribute its portion for the well-being of people.

#### 1. Adoption of hamlet

#### Reaching hamlet leader.

1.2 It is essential to develop reach with more than one hamlet that can assist to choose a hamlet whose leader is approachable, In thisNSS unit can take the help of the area authorities like District Panchayat Officer, District Tribal Welfare Officer, District Medical Officer, Extension Officer of Agriculture, Irrigation and Education Departments for choosing the village. It is to be noted that the selected hamlet should be of short distance from the college as constant contact is essential to undertake activities.

#### **Research of Hamlet/ Adopted Area**

1.3 Conducting a research to know social and economic condition is field activity that helps to know facts of Hamlet. The report of such research will provide up-to-date data for the issuess and capacity of the hamlet and guide in activity planning for the development of hamlet. This, activities may be preventing water logging, consturction of community toilets, Repairing drainage with NGO can be undertaken.

2.4 Thinking about the living conditions and position of Informal settlements residees, volunteers who has high motivation, adjustable, and mentally grown up learners are selected for solving the issues in informal settlements.

2.5 List of the activities that can be undertaken in informal settlements -

(c) Organizing Community

Volunteers can help the local communities by launching several activities like setting up a free medical distribution centre, Health campaign, Primary education, and health projects like immunization. first aid centre, child care, nutrition classes, and free legal consultancy services, etc. They can also help in making children's groups, Mahila-mandals, and SHG for Micro finance.

(c) Organizing Community: NSS volunteers develops connection with the residees, can also form community associations to solve local issues on a group basis with local resources, self-help, and mutual help.

#### **3.** Coordination with NGO

3.1 To undertake the solution to solve the issues involvement of NGO and selection of projects, about community work. NGO can also help in implementation of NSS projects. other voluntary associations like Adult Education Samitis, Nasha Bandi Boards, Yuva Mandals, and Manila Mandals can also provide added help to the NSS units. Similarly, voluntary land statutory welfare agencies such as Community Centres, Residential Institutions for children/women, and the Aged, and Institutions for the physically handicapped and disabled can also provide a assistance to the NSS volunteers to solve the issues.

Objective 1: To study the NSS program.


#### Benefit of NSS

The graph represents the distribution of NSS Awards received by individuals.

- The best NSS volunteer award is received by only a few respondents. The majority of 74.5% of respondents did not receive the award. Only 10.9% have won this award at the district level, and 10.2% have received it at the university level.
- The best NSS unit is won by a large number of respondents. 25.5% have received the award at the Indira Gandhi level. 24.8% have received it at the University level. Still, most of the respondents (32.1%) have not received the award. Also, very few 9.5% have won it at the District level and 8% at the State level.

- The proportion of respondents showing strong positive change is 35.8%
- The proportion of respondents showing somewhat positive change is 12.4%
- The proportion of respondents showing neutral changes is 13.9%
- The proportion of respondents showing somewhat negative change is 16.1%
- The proportion of respondents showing strong negative change is 21.9%

# **Objective 2:** To analyze the effectiveness of the NSS program in shaping the personality of volunteers

Regression Analysis is used to test the factors responsible for the change observed in NSS volunteers The Sig. (p-value) for 'motive of joining NSS' and Participation in NSS program' is less than or equal to 0.05 (alpha value). Therefore, this part of the research concludes that the changes observed in NSS volunteers are influenced by two factors 'Motive of joining NSS' and 'Number of NSS programmes they have participated in'. These 2 variables are considered as the significant variables.

Change in NSS volunteers = 2.392 + (0.551) Motive of joining + (-0.194) Participation in NSS program.

The value mentioned in the brackets are regression coefficient values. The change in NSS volunteer is measures on the scale of 1 to 5, 1 being the strong positive change and 5 being the strong negative change. The coefficient value of participation is negative (-0.194), in our case which indicates that more the number of participations in NSS programmes more strong positive change is observed in them. Similarly, the co-efficient of motive is 0.551 which indicates that changes observed in NSS volunteer is directly related to their clear motive of joining NSS.

#### HYPOTHESIS

- H<sub>0</sub> NSS helps in developing the personality of NSS volunteers.
- H<sub>1</sub> NSS does not help in developing the personality of NSS volunteers.

ANOVA was applied to compare the role of NSS in developing the personality of NSS volunteers. The p-value obtained for variables indicating the effects of NSS was greater than 0.05, which suggests that we retain H0. Therefore, the result concludes that NSS helps in developing the personality of NSS volunteers. It also infers that NSS changes the personality and thought process of NSS volunteers.
